- Should there be a reversal in the student population, does UNC have a plan to handle the flux? The new Provost will need to address that issue. (Kalikow)
- Following discussion on GA/TA cuts, Kalikow will provide information on the overall impact of GA/TA cuts by units.
- Feinstein raised concern about overall student employment cuts.
- Kalikow reported that some colleges cut more than they were asked to.
- Update of the Extended Campus. Director resigned and is being replaced by Professor Dallas Everhart. Everhart has a one-year contract and is tasked to sort out the finances and make recommendations to the President and Provost on what Extended Campus should be. (Kalikow)
- McGlaughlin raised concerns he had with the Office of Research. He advised there is a backlog of the grant funds being uploaded and was told that Accounting is understaffed. There are deadlines for the work to be completed, but impossible to do the work without the funds. McGlaughlin also advised that this issue has kept him from writing new proposals.
- Feinstein reported that Mark Anderson is on campus this week.
