

What were you looking at?

What did you see?

What was traffic like?

Describe the intersection for me.

When did you first see the plaintiff?

Tell me what happened after you saw the plaintiff?

#### THE CLOSING OFF PHASE

Anything else?

#### THE DEPOSITION INTERPRETER

Proceedings interpreter role and function

Officer of the court overlay

Court interpreter code of conduct

Protocol issues same as for court

Suggest video taping the interpretation
